Over the years Andrew has become an effective self-shooter. This comes from the core passion of simply wanting to get things done and make his vision a reality. This drove him to learn about the entire process; the art of framing, the effects of editing and the decisions behind directing. Andrew's latest project 'Kon-Tiki' recently won Best Music video at the New Renaissance Film Festival in London and the Grand Prize, Best of the Festival Award at the Short Cinema Film Festival in Leicester. It's also been selected to screen at the BAFTA recognised Aesthetica Film Festival later this year.
